B. PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT/PARTICIPATION

Public participation through local not-for-profits, CUSH (Clean Up Stonington Harbors) and the Avalonia Conservancy, both of which are active in the Borough. Both organizations hold beach clean-ups and public information sessions about shoreline conservation and how to garden in a more environmentally friendly way.

F. POLLUTION PREVENTION/GOOD HOUSEKEEPING FOR MUNICIPAL OPERATIONS

All Borough streets are swept every spring

All Borough catch basins were cleaned in 2014. Beginning in 2017, the Borough will clean half of its catch basins each year.

This year we did a complete survey of Borough catch basins and outfalls, updating the maps done in 1992.

We continue to use “Ice-B-Gone” to minimize the amount of sand spread on Borough streets.
